In addition to meeting regularly to monitor our goals, the teachers are implementing a new strategy for assessing student progress.



The teachers have been working together to understand and implement Learning Progressions in reading. In everyday language, learning progressions are the stages of thinking required as students develop in a particular discipline/subject. For example, as we look at the skill of retelling and summarizing a story, early on a child will simply tell an important event that occurred in a story. As a child develops, he/she will include the main character, plot, as well as important events. HES teachers are working together to identify each student's level on the progression and identify what should be

taught to move to the next level. Once we are clear with our understanding of the reading progressions, we will work with the children to help them identify where they are on the progressions and set goals for their learning. We are excited by this work because it provides a more precise understanding of students' academic development than standardized tests.

We are looking forward to a busy week next week. Each class will integrate a range of activities that help students to learn but also take into account the excitement of the various upcoming celebrations. Friday we will have our HES craft day and Holiday Celebrations. Celebrations begin at 2:40. Feel free to join us!
